

3 - Stage Type: Our optimum flooring is a sprung dance floor with smooth, clean dancing surface, suitable for both bare feet and hard shoes. A hardwood or Marley dance floor is preferred. We are unable to perform on carpeting of any kind. The type of flooring impacts the choice of repertoire. The stage/performance area must be even. (For classes and/or workshops, an uncarpeted even area of large enough size for participants to move freely must be provided.)



Six (6) pipes are ideal, however we can work with less.

1 and 2 for Balloon net, they must be next to each other since both pipes will be tied by net. Need an operator, if not possible our crew can operate it.

3 For piñatas somewhere downstage

4 For papel picado somewhere down/center stage

5 For piñatas somewhere up/center stage

6 For papel picado somewhere upstage

Preferably pipes 3-4-5-6 equidistant to each other with at least 6 feet of distance between each other

Please note any changes discussed in advancing meetings are not attached but will still be followed, and we are more than willing to work with what you are able to provide.

We request 200 standard 12-inch orange balloons, blown to 10 inches, if possible.

4.1 - Channel numbers and filter color locations are on our lighting plot.



4.2 - If you cannot supply all lighting equipment requested above, please let us know and we will adapt our lighting plot to your equipment.



4.3 - Lighting equipment must be set up prior to our arrival.

Microphone Requirements - Must be provided by the Venue

A) For Vocals: 8 vocal wireless microphones, Cardioid Dynamic, 8 Boom stands(e.g.

ADX2 HH SM 58)

B) For Violin: 4 - Omni-directional wireless Lavalier mics with belt pack and clip for violin (e.g. DPA 4061/Countryman B3 or B6/DPA 4099)

C) For Trumpets: 3 - Supercardioid on straight stands (e.g. E609). If wireless is a possibility: dpa 4099's with horn clips and belt packs

D) For the Guitar: Cardioid Condenser on boom stand (e.g. SM81/KM 184). If wireless is a possibility: dpa 4099 with guitar clip and belt pack

E) For Vihuela: Cardioid Condenser on the boom stand (e.g., SM81/KM 184). If wireless is a possibility, an omnidirectional wireless Lavalier mic (e.g., DPA 4061/Countryman B3 or B6) should be taped to the instrument and belt pack.

F) For Guitarron: Supercardioid Condenser or Cardioid Condenser (e.g. KMS 105MT/ KSM 32/M88) If wireless is a possibility: dpa 4099 to be taped on the instrument and belt pack

G) 5 floor mics for dancer foot work (e.g. PCC-160)

H) If PSM system available 10 body packs and 10 mixes (We have a portable system if the venue does not have available)

Extras:

Talk-back and intercom to the House Mix and Lighting.

Load In Schedule: May be adjusted as part of the advancing meeting.

In order to give you the best possible show, we need adequate load-in, blocking, sound check, and lighting time. This show may contain props that we will be transporting to your venue. These props may require additional set-up time for your crew. Load-in takes place the day of the show for an evening show, and the night before the show and the morning of the show day for matinees. Below are our desired Load-In Schedules. Please let us know as soon as possible of any adjustments you will need. We will meet with you one month before the show to discuss any further adjustments that may be required.

Sample Load In Schedule for the day of an evening show:

- Venue Staff Load In TBA
- 8:00am - 11:00am - Dancers arrive
 - Involves: Costume Delivery and Lighting
 - Hanging drops
 - Blocking for Dancers
 - Lighting, risers, hazer, monitors, mics taped to floor, and props, etc must be ready no later than 11:00am
- 12:00pm - Lunch (please see "Hospitality - Meals" portion of this rider)
- 1:00pm - Sound Check for Mariachi
- 2:00-5:00pm - Rehearsal
- 5:00pm - Dinner (please see "Hospitality - Meals" portion of this rider)

If load in can commence the day before the show, load in schedule will be customized with the venue.

Load In Schedule for a matinee:

- Day Before Show (If possible):
 - Afternoon/evening - Load In
 - Involves: Costume Delivery, Lighting, Risers, and Blocking
 - Dinner (please see "Hospitality - Meals" portion of this rider)
- Day of Show: (Only if arrival time prevents previous load-in)
 - 9:00am
 - Sound Check
 - Dress Rehearsal
 - 12:00pm - Lunch (please see "Hospitality - Meals" portion of this rider)
 - Afternoon matinee occurs
 - After show - Dinner (please see "Hospitality - Meals" portion of this rider)
- Day of Show: (Only if load-in occurred the previous night)
 - 11:00am

- Sound Check
- Rehearsal
- 12:00pm - Lunch (please see "Hospitality - Meals" portion of this rider)
- Afternoon matinee occurs
- After show - Dinner (please see "Hospitality - Meals" portion of this rider)

Dressing Rooms: Stationary

1. Three (03) - Dressing rooms (minimum size 20 feet x 20 feet) suggested.

- All dressing rooms must be clean and available for sound check.

2. We suggest each dressing room should have:

- appropriate lighting
- air conditioners and/or heaters
- tables
- chairs
- hangers
- private toilets with:
 - showers with hot water available*
 - soap
 - toilet paper
 - paper towels
 - at least (1) ONE hand towel per artist*
 - at least (1) ONE bath towel per artist
- AMPLE drinking water for each artist with refill station for water bottles.
- full size mirror
- A minimum of 2 steamers would be appreciated.

*If you do not have showers with hot water available, please contact Artistic Director and Agent.

3. Quick Change dressing rooms: The dancers would appreciate 2-3 large quick change dressing areas located stage right, stage left, and back of stage, if possible. Quick change areas can be created with pipe and drape. Please do not block entrances and exits to and from stage.

Purchaser agrees to provide one wardrobe assistant to support the costuming of the dancers. Wardrobe assistants to be on duty during load-in and through the performance.

Green Room

Refreshments for thirty-one (31) people should be chilled/placed on ice as needed and available from beginning of sound check until end of show.

Please have available before sound check/rehearsal:

1. - The following refreshments to be placed (on ice if needed): An adequate amount of water, soda, mineral water, soft drink (regular & diet), and 2 or 3 options of herbal teas & coffee.

2. - We suggest whole breads and toasts, whole salt crackers, cheese & cold-cut meats platter, cashew nuts, seasonal fresh fruits and dried fruits and veggie platter (carrots, broccoli, cauliflower, and dip)

All should be available during sound check until end of show if possible.

Hospitality - Meals

Breakfast

- Lodging to include breakfast OR if the company is arriving directly from the road, and/or the hotel doesn't provide breakfast, please provide breakfast.

Lunch

- Thirty-one (31) lunches to be provided on show days.
 - Time and location TBD.

Dinner:

- Thirty-one (31) hot meals including salad and dessert to be provided on show days.
 - Time and location TBD.

Time and location for meals to be confirmed in the advancing meeting.

Lodging - as per contract:

1. PLEASE KEEP OUR GROUP IN THE SAME HOTEL
2. Please have all rooms ready and keys available at front desk upon our arrival
3. 16-17 Doubles needed for cast, staff, and bus driver. (bus driver requires early check-in)

Local Transportation: Please see contract

Merchandise: If venue permits, we will sell merchandise before, during, and after the show.

1. We will provide our own merch seller.
2. Merch seller will come with their own payment software and bank.
3. Venue to provide merch table.
