The History and Sounds of "Shidaiqu"

"Shidaiqu" 时代曲, the fusion of Chinese folk and European jazz originated in 1920s Shanghai, has a fascinating history - featuring stories of beautiful movie stars, exiled jazz musicians, WWII era ballrooms, and forbidden records. This workshop offers a brief history of the genre, intertwined with song performances.

Program: 50 to 75 min workshop for college students & adults.

Highlights: - Shanghai, Europe's gateway to China. Song: "Ode to Spring."

- Zhou Xuan 周璇, a Shanghainese Billy Holiday? Song: "Wind and Rain Lullaby."
- Buck Clayton, an American jazz musician in Shanghai.
- Li Xianglan 李香兰, the Japanese/Chinese movie star. Song: "Night Jasmine."
- WWII, the Great Leap Forward and the persecution of Shidaiqu songwriters.
- The rise of Mandopop/Cantopop. Song: "Manli."






Program: 25 to 45 min worshop for elementary school children.
